

## **Pre-Arranging or Pre-Paying a Funeral**

An increasing number of people plan their own funerals, both to reduce the strain on their relatives after they die, and to ensure that they get the funeral they want.

- **Pre-Arranging** a funeral involves sorting out the details amongst the family beforehand, and often involves registering your preferences with a Funeral Director;
- **Pre-Payment** through a Funeral Director, who invests with an approved funeral bond trustee, is also helpful to some families.

The same basic information is required for either.

This form lists the decisions you will have to make to pre-plan a funeral, and the information requirements to register a death in the State of Victoria.
